

I Think I will Call it Oshkosh

A phenomenon is happening in Oshkosh, Wisconsin, and many are referring it to as the other Oshkosh. It's not in competition with AirVenture and it is not necessarily in a different place. It would best to think of it as a different place in time.

Officially AirVenture normally starts on the Monday of the last week in July. Many folks, especially volunteers are showing up two and three weeks before the official start to participate in what many view as a return to the old Oshkosh before it became AirVenture.

The nature of the "Other Oshkosh" will depend on your particular interest: Is it experimental aircraft, classic, vintage, warbird or do you just like to camp? This year we flew our plane in to Whitman Field on Thursday, July 20th, four days before Air-Venture was to start. Our interests, other than covering the event for Plane & Pilot News, was to park and camp in the Vintage area in our 1969 Cessna Skymaster.

Last year we came in on Friday and were parked on row 78 this year we got to park on row 72. We also rent a house in Neenah for the week but my son and I camped on the field Thursday and Friday nights.

Pre-Airventure there are plenty of activities on the field, the most popular is watching aircraft land on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. These are the big arrival days and it is a pleasure to wake up on the field early in the morning, have a cup of coffee with another camper, and then sit on the flightline to watch aircraft arrive at Air-Venture.

The entire pre-AirVenture time has the feel of the Oshkosh of the mid 70s and early 80s. The focus is on enjoying the aircraft and community. While the field is open to anyone to walk on, the only people that are really there, are the campers in Camp Scholler, the volunteers, and other airplane owners.

Obviously, the crowds are small, but the hospitality is large. Since everyone you see is probably an airplane owner or a pilot, there is no need to keep an eye on your aircraft.

There is another obvious reason for getting there four or five days early. You can get a much better parking spot. This is, of course is a relative term. Arriving on Thursday was a very low stress event. My son flew the Skymaster in IFR and had a straight in for Runway 27. There was plenty of parking in Vintage, so there was no question that we would get a good spot. On Friday they started parking people in row 80 and because of some reserved parking areas, by Saturday they were parking folks in row 150.

Obviously if you come in on Saturday or Sunday, all the good parking spots are gone and you're going to be parking probably in the South 40.

During the week parking spots do open up, but there is a logically complex formula for who gets these spots. First off, there has to be sufficient parking personal and guides available at that exact moment to get you to the spot. They have to know that there is an open spot. There's a preference for parking: The natural tendency is to pick unique and pretty airplane for those spots if they have

Five individuals who contributed greatly to recreational aviation were honored on November 9 as they were inducted into the EAA Sport Aviation Halls of Fame during a ceremony and dinner at the EAA Aviation Center in Oshkosh.

The 2023 inductees include:

• EAA Homebuilders Hall of Fame: Neal Loving (posthumous)

• International Aerobatic Club Hall of Fame: Lew Shattuck of Yelm, Washington

• Warbirds of America Hall of Fame: community. Those inducted into the halls Chuck Greenhill (posthumous) of fame are selected by their peers for myr-

• Vintage Aircraft Association Hall of Fame: John Parish Sr. of Tullahoma, Tennessee

• EAA Ultralights Hall of Fame: Paul Mather of Saint Elmo, Alabama

The EAA Sport Aviation Halls of Fame were established to honor the outstanding achievements of men and women in aviation who share the spirit of EAA and its community. Those inducted into the halls of fame are selected by their peers for myriad contributions made to their respective areas of aviation.

In addition, Jim Casper of Oshkosh received the Henry Kimberly Leadership Award that recognizes Oshkosh- area residents for volunteer service to EAA. Casper is a longtime volunteer EAA Aviation Museum docent and volunteer.

EAA HALLS OF FAME 2023 INDUCTEES

HOMEBUILDERS HALL OF FAME

Neal Loving (posthumous): Born in 1916 in Detroit, Michigan, Loving's passion for aviation began at an early age. He took his first flight at age 14, enrolled in an aircraft mechanics course in high school, and began learning to fly in 1938 despite difficulties finding a school that would accept Black students. Three years later, Loving designed the S-1 glider. In 1944, both of Loving's legs were amputated as a result of a crash, but did not let his disability get in the way of his aviation passion. He went on to design his most well-known aircraft, the WR-1, also known as Loving's Love, which is now on display at the EAA Aviation Museum. He became an EAA member in 1953 and won the Most Outstanding Design Award for the WR-1 at the 1954 EAA Fly-In Convention. Loving died in December 1998.

VINTAGE AIRCRAFT ASSOCIATION HALL OF FAME

John Parish Sr. (EAA 43943): Parish's pilot journey began in high school and

college where he juggled being a student with learning to fly. In 1964, he bought his first airplane, a Cherokee 180 and began attending fly-ins across the country. Over time, Parish grew an affinity for one airplane in particular, the Beechcraft Model 17 Staggerwing. Parish was finally able to purchase one of his own in 1970. Parish became continuously more involved with the International Staggerwing Club and in 1973, John and his wife Charlotte helped establish the Staggerwing Museum Foundation, now known as the Beechcraft Heri-*See "EAA" on page 5*

INTERNATIONAL AEROBATIC CLUB HALL OF FAME

Lew Shattuck (EAA 88175): Before getting started in aerobatics, Shattuck enlisted in the U.S. Air Force in 1952, where he gained experience flying many different military fighter aircraft. In the summer of 1966, Shattuck was captured after his F-105 was shot down in North Vietnam and was held as a prisoner for more than six years before being released. He retired from the Air Force in 1976 as a full Colonel. Despite an eye injury suffered during his time in captivity, Shattuck wanted to continue flying. He purchased a Pitts Special and began practicing aerobatics. Shattuck won the Pitts Cup trophy in the 1978 IAC Championships. He continued to fly in

competitions until 2018 at the age of 85. Shattuck also served as a mentor for pilots and judges for many years.

WARBIRDS OF AMERICA HALL OF FAME

Charles "Chuck" Greenhill (posthumous): Greenhill's involvement in warbird restoration began soon after his time serving in the U.S. Army. His skills as a tool and die maker helped bring warbird aircraft back to life. Working alongside his wife Bev, they restored warbirds back to their original condition. Notable among his numerous restoration projects is the only surviving Grumman J2F-4 Duck from the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor. Greenhill's restorations frequently appeared at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh during the 2000s and 2010s, earning him 2007 World War II Grand Champion, 2003 and 2005 Reserve Grand Champion, and the 2014 Preservation award. He also used his aviation passion to inspire the next generation by attending fly-ins and letting children see his aircraft up close and learn about their

ULTRALIGHTS HALL OF FAME

Paul Mather (EAA 154506): Paul Mather began flying in 1974 at age 18 and has flown a variety of ultralights, including hang gliders and Quicksilver footlaunch models. In 1980, Mather landed a job with Quicksilver, primarily in sales and marketing with the goal of establishing a dealer network. His work took him across the globe, as he became an international representative in 1982. One of Mather's greatest achievements came in 1984 when he flew a MXL Il aircraft nonstop from Annaba, Algeria, to Monaco over the Mediterranean Sea, setting multiple FAI records. Mather left Quicksilver in 1995 to start his own venture, M-Squared Aircraft, which produces a variety of aircraft including the Breese-XL, a part 103 ultralight vehicle. Mather also became a Designated Airworthiness Representative for the FAA in 2008, having certificated more than 500 LSA and amateur-built aircraft.

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

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

Biden administration to release aviation fuel subsidy guidance by year's end-Agriculture Secretary

The follow section made me scratch my head:

When asked if he was confident that ethanol will become an SAF feedstock, Vilsack said he was. The billions of dollars of subsidies the ethanol industry hopes to have access to are part of last year's Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), President Joe Biden's signature climate law. SAF producers seeking tax credits must demonstrate with an approved scientific model that their fuel generates 50% less greenhouse gas emissions over its lifecycle than petroleum fuel.

Midwest ethanol producers have asked the administration to adopt

the Department of Energy's Greenhouse Gases, Regulated **Emissions** and Energy Use in Technologies (GREET), which would enable ethanolbased SAF to qualify, while environmentalists want standards that would favor inputs like used cooking oil and animal fat.

Vilsack also said that updates to GREET underway at USDA primarily deal with how the model calculates emissions from tilling land to grow crops.

How does the Lightspeed Zulu 3 compare to the Bose A20?

We are often asked by pilots, what is the difference between the Zulu 3 and the Bose A20. We know that this is an important choice to have to make, because both represent the very best in pilot headsets in the market at this time. They're actually a lot more similar than they

Controls and features are virtually identical in both functions and form. Whether it's Bluetooth connectivity for voice or audio, auto shut off, or comm priority, they're virtually identical. They both utilize 2 AA batteries with a useful life of 40+ hours. Both headsets offer a panel powered, "LEMO" single audio and power connection for planes equipped with a jack system.

So what ARE the differences?

There are specific design details that allow the Zulu to deliver greater comfort. With the Zulu, the ear seals have 30% more padding which provides a better seal and distributes side pressure more evenly. The ear opening has 50% more room in the cup for your ear. The stainless steel headband shape and head pad system are VERY different than the A20. The Zulu has a very low profile, designed to naturally contour to your head.

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EAA Foundation Scholarship Applications Now Open

The application process for next year's EAA Aviation Scholarships is now open. Every year, the EAA Aviation Foundation awards more than \$1 million in scholarships for students over the age of 16. The window for applying for the funds closes on March 1, 2024.

Becca Greskoviak, EAA Scholarship & Fund Steward Coordinator, said, "The costs of training and education can be one of the biggest challenges students face when trying to achieve their goals. EAA is able to help break down that barrier through our scholarship program."

Money is available through the EAA Aviation Foundation scholarships for flight training at any flight school in the United States or Canada that is not affiliated with a university program. In addition, post-secondary collegiate scholarships can help cover tuition and associated costs for programs in the United States including, but not limited to, aerospace or aeronautical engineering, aviation business administration, air traffic control, aviation maintenance, professional flight or any aviation-related **STEM**

field, according to EAA. One of the newest among the EAA scholarships is the Aviation Tax Consultants (ATC) Fred Scholarship **McCarter** Fund. The scholarship was created to honor McCarter. an accountant who recognized a need for specialized consulting for people who purchase general aviation aircraft and started ATC to fill the need. McCarter died in September 2022, and the post-secondary scholarship was created to keep his legacy going. It will be awarded for the first time in May 2024 to someone seeking a career in aviation, with a preference to someone going into a non-pilot career.

As far as Vintage is concerned there are some short cuts to get a good spot. I would suggest flying in a Beech 18 or any vintage twin amphibian. I would not recommend DC-3s however, they were parked down near row 190.

There are some disadvantages to showing up early, there is limited or no food service. You can however order pizza or use DoorDash to have food delivered. The distributers will not be open. There is no organized transportation system on the field until Saturday. If, however you have made arrangements for a car, you have all of Oshkosh to explore without the crowds.

There is no question that the formal AirVenture has

an energy and excitement. It is unlike any other aviation event in the world. I have attended every one held since 1973. For us it is a family event and would not miss it, but I do miss the old days.

I think I am going to start calling the pre-AirVenture event, "Oshkosh."



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
