

Ohio, Legal Marijuana, and the FAA

On December 7, 2023 Ohio Issue 2, which make marijuana legal in Ohio, went into effect. The new Ohio law allows possession of up to 2.5 oz of cannabis and up to 15 grams of extracts.

The question now that comes up, "What does this mean to pilots in Ohio?"

The simple answer is that it does not mean a thing.

Let's start with the proposition that the federal government classifies marijuana as a Schedule 1 Drug. The feds also do not recognize any medical use for marijuana. It is a federal offence to use or possess marijuana.

Now unless you are growing large quantities of marijuana, or you are growing it on federal property, or are in the marijuana transportation industry, federal agencies rarely take any great interest in prosecuting marijuana related offences

Just because some states, including Ohio, have now legalized the use or possession of marijuana, it does not mean that it is a good idea to smoke marijuana for those in the aviation field. There are still lots of consequences if being caught with or using marijuana.

The federal government regulates drugs through the Controlled Substances Act, 21 U.S.C. § 811. A first-time conviction for possession of marijuana carries with it the potential of up to one year in jail and up to \$1,000 fine. For a second offense there is a mandatory 15 days in jail. The good news here is that you will probably be in a federal jail which is much nicer than the average municipal or county jail. A third offense conviction can be a felony. With any luck at all you could be in a cell with a person convicted of violating copyright warnings posted at the beginning of a home DVD movie.

In times past, where I typically saw marijuana possession being a problem were motor vehicle stops. Here is what typically happened: A car is stopped for a simple traffic law violation; the officer asks the driver of the car if there are any illegal drugs

or large sums of money in the car. The driver thinking that marijuana is not illegal responds; "No," and then grant permission to search the car. The officer then proceeds to search the car and finds the marijuana, usually in the console between the two front seats.

I will not be seeing these cases anymore.

But life for a pilot is not that simple, The Application for Airman Medical Certificate, question 18.n. asks, "Substance dependence or failed drug test ever: or substance abuse or the use of illegal substance in the last two years."

Marijuana has been illegal for more than 50 years according to the Federal Government. It qualifies as an illegal substance. Obviously, if you have used marijuana, even Ohio legal marijuana in the last two years the answer to question 18 n. must be, "Yes."

You can expect your medical examiner to ask some follow-up questions. This is actually where life gets both very simple and

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



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

able accessories to increase battery longevity, reduce vibration shake, and provide metal camera cases and prop filters for visibility and safety.

Cameras like Go-Pro and Insta360 have software that help minimize vibration. This image stabilization feature uses battery very quickly. To reduce this effect, aviators will use our VibeX technologies that will reduce vibration, increase battery life, and produce better images and videos.

When using commercial off the shelf (COTS) cameras you will notice they are very well



engineered to work well on the ground. The camera shells are made of ABS plastic and are susceptible to breakage during cold weather flights or cold at higher altitudes. The solution is to use a metal, camera safe cases. The metal construction and precision engineering will keep the camera case from breaking and will provide safe housing

during fights.

For internal cameras, we find that many aviators will mount their cameras on the glareshield, dash, or hang from the ceiling and video their flight through the propeller. This prop wash is distracting and makes it difficult to see what the pilot sees. The camera case is a standard 52mm lens receptacle that will accommodate UV and ND filters, depending on the environment and sun. "Turning the Tide – 1944" 80-year commemoration at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024

EAA will pay tribute to the heroes and sacrifices made during the Normandy landings on D-Day (June 6, 1944), and throughout the year 1944, with an 80-year "Turning the Tide" commemoration at EAA AirVenture Oshkosh 2024 on July 23 and 24.

"As the number of veterans from WWII who are still with us are dwindling, it is important to commemorate the events of 1944, and the importance of the campaigns in both Europe and the Pacific to preserve freedom," said Rick Larsen, EAA's vice president of communities and member programs, who coordinates AirVenture features and attractions. "This year's programming during AirVenture week will connect the human events and aviation history of that year so those of us today have a better understanding of those times."

A collection of C-47s from the D-Day Squadron will be on display as part of the commemoration. The Squadron features a fleet of unique C-47 aircraft from throughout the United States. Many of these aircraft will be part of a commemorative mission to Europe in May and June 2024. The C-47 played a vital role in transporting more than 13,000 paratroopers to Utah Beach for the Normandy landings.

Afternoon air shows on July 23 and 24 will feature warbirds from both the Pacific and European Theatres including the World War II Airborne Demonstration Team The team will be jumping from their own C-47 using traditional round canopy parachutes, reminiscent of the paratroopers of the 82nd and 101st Airborne Divisions who risked their lives in Normandy.

The Theater in the Woods presentation

on the evening of Tuesday, July 23, will focus on 1944 as well. The presentation will be split into two parts; the first will retell the story of 1944, while the second part will go into detail about the aircraft. More details about the presentation, including guests, will be announced as they are finalized.

Additional aircraft that played key roles in 1944 have also been invited to participate, and EAA and the EAA Warbirds of America continue to plan activities as part of the commemoration.



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

Electron Unveils All-electric Five-seat Utility Aircraft

The Dutch start-up aims to be ready to start deliveries in 2028

Electron Aerospace is stepping up work to bring a five-seat all-electric aircraft to market by the end of this decade. The Dutch start-up unveiled an updated design for the Electron 5 model, for which it intends to start deliveries in 2028.

As battery technology continues to improve incrementally, the company believes the Electron 5 model will have an operational range of 500 kilometers (310 miles), including anticipated safety reserves for energy equal to an additional 250 km. According to co-founder and CEO Josef Mouris, for the regional air mobility market, the company initially intends to address city-pair sectors of around 370 km and at a speed of 350 km/h.

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tric aircraft. "But we soon found there wasn't anything suitable out there," Mouris told AIN. "The [two-seat] Pipistrel [Electro] is too small and the [nine-seat] Eviation Alice still had uncertifiable engines on the wing tip back then and is simply too big for the market we want to address. We didn't want eVTOL aircraft because we don't think these fit existing certification and operating standards and will not have the required range nor the low operations costs of a pure electric eCTOL. What we needed was something like an electrified Diamond DA62, but unfortunately retrofitting does not work."

Having resolved to develop its own aircraft, Electron decided to offer this to other operators initially to establish where it might fit in the market. It has previously signed memorandums of understanding with South Korea's Mint

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"Electron" from page 10 Air and Australian aircraft distributor FlyOnE. Along with an agreement with Danish-German logistics group Danx Carousel, it said the value of pre-orders now totals more than €230 million (about \$250 million).

The Electron 5 design features a long wingspan, a canard, and a cruciform-configured tail. With its twin pusher propellers, the aircraft is (in appearance) somewhat reminiscent of Piaggio's Avanti turboprop. Operating with a single pilot, it would seat up to four passengers or carry 500 kilograms (1,100 pounds) of freight on a standard European pallet and be able to operate from short landing strips of less than 800 meters (2,600 feet).

The company presented the new design to investors in late January, before making it public this week. "Taking inspiration from the albatross, our Electron 5 features an aerodynamically efficient body, robust wings, and windows that mimic the bird's vigilant eyes," explained Electron's head of design, Alexander Klatt. For freight operators, the aircraft can include a cargo door in the side of the fuselage.

So far. Electron has built a

pair of cabin mockups to validate use cases with customers that could include cargo and emergency medical support, as well as passenger flights in single-pilot operations. It is working with Dassault Systèmes' design and engineering software with plans to forge further agreements with partners to supply key technology such as the propulsion system, batteries, avionics, and other components.

More Funding Needed to **Get to Market**

Having raised an undisclosed seven-figure amount for the program, Electron is now seeking additional financial backers. Mouris acknowledged the current environment for finding investors in electric aviation is proving challenging, with more money having gone previously to eVTOL start-ups than to new fixed-wing models looking to unlock transportation options from numerous under-utilized small airports.

"Our main goal is to convert ground trips involving four- to eight-hour drives [into sub-regional flights]," Mouris explained, pointing to sector examples, such as Dutch towns Groningen, Twente, and Maastricht to larger cities like Copenhagen, Paris, and Berlin. This approach would also avoid travelers having to make inefficient trips to larger hub airports

Mouris, a former airline pilot with FlyBe, founded Electron with Marc-Henry de Jong, a management consultant with extensive experience in sustainability businesses. Electron's engineering team has previously held senior roles with companies including Fokker, Airbus, GKN Aerospace, Embraer, Lockheed Martin, and General Atomics.

Initially, the business began in the UK but in the wake of the country's Brexit departure from the European Union (EU). Electron is now incorporated in the Dutch city of Rotterdam so that it can work directly under EASA's jurisdiction. Mouris told AIN that government funding opportunities in the EU are better suited to product development than in the UK.

The company aims to complete EASA type certification by the end of 2027. It is preparing to file an application for a design organization approval from the European air safety regulator but has not yet indicated when it intends to build and fly a full-scale prototype.

complicated at the same time. The question. "Have you ever use(d) illegal substances in the last two years?", is a lot like the question, "Have you ever advocated the overthrowing the of the United States Government? The obvious answer is, NO. Any other answer is going to create a lot of problems.

That being the case, if you want to be a professional or non-professional pilot, you do not ever want to be put into the position where you have to answer those questions, "yes."

Don't even think about lying on your FAA medical application. If you are caught, this can be a felony in violation of 18 U.S.C. 1001. I personally find it offensive that the federal government can be untruthful with us, but we are not allowed to lie to the federal govern-

ment. That's the law and we have to live with it. The FAA takes an equally dim view of falsification, and the only penalty allowed under the Federal Aviation Regulations is a revocation of all your certificates.

A revocation is not all that bad, after one year, if you want to fly again, all you will have to do is retake all the writtens, and all the practical examinations, for all your certificates. You do get to keep all the hours you have accumulated.

There are other possible offenses, 14 C.F.R. 91.19 prohibits the transporting of marijuana or other narcotic drugs in a civil aircraft. 14 CFR 61.15 provides for the suspension or revocation of all your certificates and loss of your aircraft if caught transporting illegal drugs. Even if you are in a state where marijuana is legal.


Here is the bottom line. Marijuana is an illegal substance. Before you use marijuana in anv form contact your airman medical examiner. Further do not rely on advice from your family physician regarding the FAA position on marijuana use. The AMA is not the FAA.

The FAA has created an information circular cleverly called, "Marijuana Can't Fly". It is available on the web and is a bit scarier than this article.

Here preventive action is probably the best action. If you are looking at an aviation career don't use marijuana and/or any illegal drugs. It really is that simple.

Preflight and 100 hour/ annual inspection tips are reviewed regarding the Hartzell Aviation products and aircraft referenced. Highlights include:

Checking play in a propeller blade, making sure it always returns to the center.

Looking for indications of propeller lightning strikes.

Learning why NYCO GN3058 propeller grease is not compatible with AeroShell Grease 5,6 and 22.

How the turbocharger controller connects directly to the wastegate.

How a major concern in any exhaust system is fire, due to temperatures of up to approximately 1.600 degrees F.

How single engine aircraft derive their cabin heat from the engine exhaust system and twinengine aircraft typically use a separate cabin combustion heater assembly.

How it is important to draw the entire exhaust system up evenly, not one cylinder at a time.



Why engine mounts are typically manufactured from 4130 Chromoly steel.

Why it is recommended to remove the engine mount for a thorough inspection at engine overhaul since it supports the engine in all phases of ground and flight operations.

Three important points

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when inspecting a starter are the electrical connection. mounting hardware and cracks/ chafing.

The two types of alternators used on a Cirus SR22T: one is belt driven and the other engine driven.

How a loose alternator output wire can cause arcing and burn through the stud.

Alternator Instructions for Continued Airworthiness (ICA) as a factory recommendation.

Gear driven alternators and the recommended 500-hour inspection for the coupling installed.

Always ensure magneto switch is "off" when performing maintenance, especially if movement of the propeller is required.

maintenance should be performed using applicable maintenance and overhaul manuals, active Service Bulletins, Service Letters, Service Advisories/ Instructions along with any FAA Airworthiness Directives.

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
